1. Town of North Hempstead Bay Constables monitor VHF Channels 9 & 16 from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m.
2. Complimentary pump-out service is available at the Town Dock, located on Main Street in Port Washington.
3. *Marine 9*, North Hempstead's complimentary pump-out boat, is available on VHF Channel 9.
4. Transient mooring is available to visitors at Town Dock. For information and reservations, call (516) 767-4622.
5. For general inquires, or to reach the pump-out boat or a Bay Constable, call (516) 767-4622.
6. The Nassau County Police Marine Bureau can be reached on VHF Channel 16 as "Nassau County Police", or in an emergency by dialing 911.
7. Port Washington Water Taxi is available on VHF Channel 9 or by calling (516) 767-1691.

GONE FISHING?

North Hempstead Town Supervisor Judi Bosworth, the Town Board and the Town's Bay Constables would like to remind residents about new signage and designated receptacles which have been placed around six Town fishing sites. These new receptacles encourage fishermen to discard non-biodegradable monofilament fishing line properly, which will help protect fish and wildlife. According to the Audubon Society, monofilament fishing line is an amazingly strong substance that gets snagged on many things in the environment. Discarded line can snag and kill fish, turtles, frogs, birds, and small mammals. The receptacles have been placed at Gerry Pond Park in Roslyn; Searingtown Pond Park in Searingtown; the Town Dock in Port Washington; Manorhaven Park in Manorhaven; North Hempstead Beach Park in Port Washington; and Ridder's Pond Park in New Hyde Park.

TIPS FOR SAFE BOATING IN NEW YORK


1. In Manhasset Bay, Hempstead Harbor, and Little Neck Bay there is a 5 mph speed limit and No Wake Zone within 300 feet of shore or mooring fields.
2. Boats must give way to emergency vehicles when their blue emergency lights are activated.
3. Boating while intoxicated is a crime. **DO NOT DRINK AND DRIVE!** Bay Constables will be out to enforce boating while intoxicated laws.
4. All personal watercraft (PWCs) must be operated by a boater over the age of 14 who is in possession of a New York State Safe Boater Certificate.
5. All persons on a PWC must **WEAR** their personal flotation devices (Type I, II, or III).
6. Do not exceed the number of passengers stated on the Coast Guard Occupancy plate.
7. North Hempstead waters are a **NO-DISCHARGE ZONE**. Boaters may not discharge waste (human or water) or oil into the waters of North Hempstead. Violators will be fined.
8. Saltwater fishing requires a New York State permit. Permits are available at the Town of North Hempstead Clerk's Office. Saltwater fishing permits are free.
9. Remain inside marked channels.



Red colors and lights should be on your right (starboard) side when travelling **from** open waters (shoreward)
