



Senator Gillibrand and Congressman Ackerman Support Local Effort on Jobs and Infrastructure

Senator Kirsten Gillibrand and Congressman Gary Ackerman joined Supervisor Jon Kaiman along with other town, village and district officials calling for federal dollars to be directed at infrastructure projects in the Town of North Hempstead. A top priority would be the new environmentally friendly sewage treatment plant being proposed in Great Neck that would replace two aging plants located on Manhasset Bay. The new plant will create hundreds of jobs and, once completed, lead to cleaner water in Manhasset Bay and the Long Island Sound.

The Town encourages residents to take advantage of E-Waste Disposal Drop-off every Sunday from 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at 999 West Shore Road, Port Washington.

Composting Cooperative of North Hempstead

This summer, North Hempstead will launch Long Island's first composting cooperative. Composting benefits the environment by helping keep trash out of our landfills and by returning valuable organic matter to the soil to be used again.
