

Did You Know?

- In 1775, a group of North Hempstead patriots declared their allegiance to the revolutionary cause and broke away from the Town of Hempstead which was predominantly loyal to England at the time.

- The Town of North Hempstead was officially established through an act of the New York State Legislature in 1784.



- In the 19th Century, North Hempstead became the seat of Queens County, which included the three towns of North Hempstead, Hempstead and Oyster Bay.
- In 1899, each of these three towns incorporated and became the County of Nassau.


