



# TOWN OF NORTH HEMPSTEAD HISTORIC BUILDINGS AND SITES



**E**

The **Denton House** in New Hyde Park, built circa 1875 and now a McDonald's Resturant, bears a remarkable resemblance to early Long Island farmhouses.

The appearance and architectural integrity of landmarked structures are protected by town law. To date, the town has given landmark status to sixteen historic locations at the recommendation of its Historical Landmark Preservation Commission.

**C**

Toll roads such as Jericho Turnpike and North Hempstead Turnpike (Northern Boulevard), built by enterprising private citizens, provided improved highways to 19th century travelers. This **Roslyn Tollhouse**, built circa 1850, is now situated in Roslyn Cemetery a few hundred feet from its original location.

Port Washington's **Thomas Dodge House**, built in 1719 in Dutch style is one of the oldest houses on the Cow Neck peninsula.

Built in 1908, the **Main Street School** educated thousands of Port Washington students until it closed in 1985.

This impressive residence facing Northern Boulevard in Manhasset was built in 1836 by Judge Horatio Gates **Onderdonk**.
